Our January 2021 knit along (KAL), *Festival of Stitches*, comes highly recommended by customers Carla L and Mary Lou F. This fun and playful project from designer Lisa Hannes promises to keep you engaged from start to finish. Different sections make it almost addictive and it knits up quickly. The finished item will add a wonderful

highlight to your daily wardrobe with a shape that is versatile and easy to wear.

While there's lots of colorwork in the pattern, the stitches are rather uncomplicated – mosaic, slipped stitches and color blocking. There are also some cables, eyelets and stripes, but no super complicated techniques are used in this pattern. Each section contains fully written instructions and charts so you can choose which you prefer to work with. Every section in this pattern is completely adjustable to your liking or the yarn/yardage you have available. Designed for fingering weight yarn in 3 contrasting colors, this pattern was originally released as a mystery knit along, and it is still in its original format with the separate clues (Ravelry Pro download, \$6.83 US).

## \*\*\* SOOTHING STITCHING AS A MOOD BOOSTER \*\*\*

Several friends of our LYS recommended an article written by Kate Atherley published in *The New York Times* on December 19, 2020. Here are excerpts:

"Already an excellent winter activity in an ordinary year, knitting is even better suited to 2021, when we're encouraged to stay home and restrict our social circles ... But the craft can also trigger mental health benefits. Many studies have been published that show knitting helps to manage chronic pain, improve cognitive function and even increase happiness. Perhaps most relevant in these uncertain times, a survey of knitters taken last year by the Abo Akademi University in Finland indicated that they felt knitting 'can be a counterbalance to a stressful job, hectic lifestyle or other demanding situations in life'...

It's well known in knitting circles that there are two types of knitters: those that focus on the results – a comfortable sweater, mittens to match a new winter coat, a gift for an upcoming baby shower – and those who focus on the process. Process knitters knit for knitting's sake. They value the soothing repetitive motion and the feel of the yarn running through their fingers, relish the colors, the act of creation. They enjoy the good things that come with it, without having to fuss about their work being perfect, or their scarf being stylish. If you are thinking of picking up knitting, think of it as meditation with a little bit of equipment. Approach it for the joy of the process and to take some pressure off. (Also, it's a good way to keep your hands out of the candy bowl if you want to change your eating habits.)

And, if the result is something that can keep you (or a friend or family member) warm, it's a fantastic bonus. Just think: Scarves! Hats! Mittens! Sweaters! Stylish statements, gifts for loved ones, blankets to welcome new babies. Once you become more accomplished, you'll be a mitten machine.

Rubee Dewji, a Canadian software developer who lives on her own, took up knitting in the early spring at the encouragements of some friends. Before the pandemic, Ms. Dewji, 31, filled her spare time playing music in bands; she found playing on her own during lockdown just emphasized her loneliness. 'I've mostly made things for other people, and I realized that when you are making something for someone you love, you are thinking about them with every single stitch, and somehow that feels less lonely even though I am doing it all alone,' she said."

- \*\*\* "PLAN AHEAD" TIPS AND TRICKS \*\*\*
- Always leave a long tail when casting on for use is seaming less ends to bury!
- Start new yarn ends at the beginning of a row and bury the tail into seams and not into the knitted fabric. Knitted fabric moves and stretches and this will keep ends from popping out of your work.
- When seaming the body of a garment, work an extra yard or two into the a side seam to be used for mending holes, if needed. For a cardigan, sew in an extra button if one needs to be replaced.
- If a garment is worked with a bulky or textured yarn, use a smooth yarn in a matching color for working the seams, to make them neater, more stable and less bulky.

Nan R generously shared her vintage checkboard dishcloth pattern with us (shown right). Thanks, Nan!

Finished Size: Approx. 9" X 10-1/2"

Materials: Worsted weight cotton, approx. 150 yards (our photographed dishcloth used Plymouth Yarn *Fantasy Naturale*, shade 5398); US size 8 knitting needles or size needed to obtain gauge

Gauge: 18 stitches = 4" in stockinette stitch (knit one row, purl one row) Directions: Cast on 40 stitches loosely.

Row 1 (right side): Knit.

Rows 2-7: Knit.

Row 8: Knit 4, purl 32, knit 4.

Row 9: Knit 6; \*Purl 4, knit 2; repeat from \* to last 4 stitches, end knit 4.

Row 10: \*Knit 4, purl 2; repeat from \* to last 4 stitches, end knit 4.

Rows 11 & 12: Repeat rows 9 and 10 once more.

Row 13: Knit.

Row 14: Knit 4, purl 32, knit 4.

Row 15: Knit 4, purl 3; \*knit 2, purl 4; repeat from \* to last 9 stitches, end knit 2, purl 3, knit 4.

Row 16: Knit 7; \*purl 2, knit 4; repeat from \* to last 9 stitches, end purl 2, knit 7.

Rows 17 & 18: Repeat rows 15 & 16 once more.

Rows 19 through 66: Repeat rows 7 through 18 four more times.

Rows 67 through 72: Knit.

Bind off all stitches. Weave in ends.

\*\*\* V-8 SOUP \*\*\*

Nan R also shared her card club's recipe for a delicious, hearty soup that is sure to warm up your spirits on a chilly winter day. Kathy added the onion, parsley and soup greens. Ingredients:

- 1 lb. ground meat (Kathy used 90% lean beef, but OK to use ground turkey or chicken)
- 2 large bottles V-8 vegetable juice
- 1 onion, diced
- 1 large bag frozen mixed vegeatable
- 1 bag shredded "angel hair" cabbage or 1 small head cabbage, thinly sliced
- 2 tbsp. parsley
- 2 tbsp. dehydrated soup greens (optional)

In large Dutch oven, brown meat and onion. When meat no longer pink, add V-8 and bring to a boil. Add vegetables and soup greens, then cabbage. Cook tuntil cabbage tender (about 20 minutes).

This recipe allows for easy experimenting with other veggies and herbs. Thanks, Nan!

### **CLASS DESCRIPTIONS**

About *Make A Million Shawl* (shown lower right), Cynthia tells us: "This 'recipe pattern' will allow you to combine different colors and textures to create a beautiful shawl! You can use any type of yarn for this shawl. Start with 3 or 4 colors (all the same weight), and if you need to buy more, you can do that later! Bring a long circular needle two sizes larger than the yarn normally takes. (ex., If you're making this shawl out of fingering weight yarn , you should bring a size 4 or 5 long needle.)" The pattern is *Make A Million Shawl* by Really Clear Designs, and will be provided by Kathy's Kreations.

There is nothing like Fair Isle to give the knitter the creativity to combine vibrant colors with stunning patterns. Fair Isle is traditionally done using one yarn in each hand. This sounds intimidating, but it's easier than you think -- and far more addicting than you ever

bargained for. This pattern *Fair Isle Headband* (shown page 8, lower right) will also be provided by Kathy's Kreations and contains two different headbands. The first has just two colors, and the second amps up your skill level with a few more!
