Peach packs a pastel punch and vivid pink is the new power shade. This colorway adds a pop of fresh color for a new take on happy, spring-ready colors. We have also received a new shipment of "Super Silky" (\$29.95, 100 grams, 400 yards, 80% superwash merino/20% silk, CYCA #2) in feminine co-ordinating colors: yellow submarine, himalayan salt, cactus flower, lady lavender, just call me peaches, ice ice baby and main squeeze. This yarn has a gorgeous drape and elegant sheen that looks and feels so soft! This is the perfect yarn for a fine-gauge wrap or shawl for warmer weather ahead. Each skein is hand-dyed with love and care by Emma...

Spring it on! We introduced Casapinka's textured *Powder Wrap* (\$7.00, Ravelry Pro download) last month and our cream-colored shop model stops knitters right in their tracks. Many of you have said that this looks like "a bride's shawl". We have received additional supplies of HiKOO "Sueno Worsted" (\$17.50, 100 grams, 182 yards, 80% merino superwash/20% viscose from bamboo, CYCA #4), which drapes beautifully. Casapinka tells us that this wrap can also be made in a DK weight. Kathy has cast on another *Powder Wrap* with Himalayan Salt, an icy pink shade of EMMA's YARN "Drapey DK" (\$33.50, 100 grams, 231 yards, 70% superwash merino/30% silk, CYCA #3). It's gonna be a stunner, too!

This just in, earlier than expected! The Maryland Road Trip Mystery Knit Along with Cynthia Spencer and Valerie Reed will kick off April 17, 2021. We have already received our first shipment of kit combinations from BAAH Yarns in their splendid "La Jolla" fingering weight superwash merino wool (\$125.00 per kit). Hurry in to see them before we sell out or view them at roadtripmystery.com. We can still order your favorite for you before March 15 to ensure arrival before April 17, 2021. They are so pretty! Vibrant color kit combinations from Maryland cities, historic sites and famous landmarks include #1 Quoth the Raven; #2 Crossing the Bay; #3 On The Boardwalk; #4 Underwater; #5 Deep Creek; #6 Almost Oriole; #7 Anchors Aweigh; #8 Charm City. Warning – it's hard to pick just one, they're all spectacular!

Another fun pattern from CASAPINKA is coming in mid-March! *The Birdwatcher* is a cropped, loose-wearing sleeveless top worked from the bottom up, in the round. At the underarms, the front and back are split and worked flat until the seaming at the shoulders. German short rows are used to provide some shaping at the shoulders for a comfortable fit. Knit in fingering weight – we have fresh supplies of scrumptious hand-dyed yarns for this cute top with a lace border...

The wait is almost over – HiKOO "Sueno Tweed DK" (\$18.50, 100 grams, 255 yards, 69% superwash merino wool/16% viscose from bamboo/15% viscose flecks, CYCA #3) will soon be here! This Peruvian yarn is a blend of soft superwash merino and bamboo, and is made with strength and wearability in mind. The perfect amount of spring makes knitting and crocheting a pleasure and allows for a variety of suitable gauges. This washable yarn is perfect for socks, sweaters, kids wear, and hard-wearing garments that will last a lifetime. It also feels incredible. What to make? For starters, we will be knitting TIN CAN KNITS *Beloved* bonnet (\$5.00, Ravelry Pro download, shown lower right). There's nothing quite so darling as a sweetie kept cozy warm by a perfect little hand knit! This bonnet fits the bill, with intriguing construction designed to stay put and frame that beloved little face...

*** MARCH 2021 KNIT ALONG (KAL) ***

The *Botanique* shawl by designer Casapinka (\$7.00 Ravelry Pro download, shown left) began here as a knit along in late February and continues through March. *Botanique* is an intermediate level boomerang-shaped shawl, knit on the bias with sections that are inspired by botanicals and spring. We still have EMMA's YARN kits available for this project. This is an engaging knit with some interesting techniques and stitches...

The *Anne of Green Gables* mini-KAL will run only 2 weeks, from March 12–26, 2021. The pattern will be released on March 11, 2021, and it requires a single skein of speckled, tonal, or solid fingering in 400 yards with two 80 yard mini skeins for small accents (think of flowers in the spring for color inspiration). The project is a surprise but Casapinka tells us it can be done easily in two weeks and promises to be a fun KAL. Create your own "Anne" experience...

Let's Knit A Hat! is a fun skill-building opportunity offered by instructor Karen McCullough on **Tuesday, March 2, 2021; 1:00 pm - 3:00 pm**. This month's topper, *Helix Hat*, features easy, clean multi-colored stripes knit in the round. There are no yarns to carry or floats on the backside. There is no jagged edge or jog in the stripe sequence. There are no additional ends to weave in. The *Helix* uses only one simple continuous spiral strand for each color from start to finish (photo page 8, upper left). Please choose three contrasting and coordinating colors of worsted weight yarn for the most effective striping. You will need 2 oz. of each color of worsted weight yarn, US sizes 6 & 7 16" circular knitting needles, US size 7 double-pointed needles and stitch markers. Pattern is included with the class registration fee of \$20.00...

Our *Building Blocks* class series continues on **Tuesday, March 16, 2021; 1:00 pm -3:00 pm** with instructor Karen McCullough. This knitting series was designed by Michelle Hunter specifically to help grow your skills while you navigate through major knitting techniques and principles while knitting sampler squares to eventually make an afghan. Each class will focus upon a technique to broaden your understanding. This month's topic is *Yarn Over and Bobbles*. A yarn over is a simple increase resulting in a "hole on purpose" that is the basis for lace knitting. A yarn over is usually paired with a decrease to maintain the stitch count. Bobbles add texture and charm to any knitted garment. The simple bobble had its origins in Irish knitting and can be found in many Aran sweaters. The recommended yarn is HiKOO "Simpliworsted", a lovely blend of superwash merino and premium acrylic/nylon that is very soft and durable. Registration fee is \$20.00 per session plus purchase of book and yarn from Kathy's Kreations. Want to learn more? *** COLOR PALETTE FOR SPRING 2021 ***

Pantone chose the hues of illuminating (yellow) and ultimate gray as the 2021 colors of the year. Leatrice Eiseman, Executive Director of the Pantone Color Institute tells us: "Practical and rock solid but at the same time warming and optimistic, this is a color combination that gives us stability and hope." Kerry Fosbrink of YOUGHIOGHENY YARNS refers to them as "grelow" – ask to see her fingering yarn/mini in this combo from the trunk show!

This season's report also features the top 10 standout colors as well as current takes on the five core classics we can expect to see in spring/summer collections. This is a range of ten shades inspired by the beauty of nature, supporting flexibility and reinvention:

Raspberry Sorbet: Vivifying Raspberry Sorbet tantalizes

Burnt Coral: Inviting burnt coral expresses conviviality

Rust: An earth-inspired brown emblematic of autumn leaves uncharacteristic of a spring palette

Marigold: a comforting golden orange-infused yellow lends a warming presence

Illuminating: friendly and joyful, an optimistic yellow offering the promise of a sunny day

Mint: Tasty mint refreshes and restores

Green Ash: A mentholated green that cools and soothes

Cerulean: the color of the sky on a serene, crystal clear day

French blue: a stirring blue hue that awakens a vision of Paris in the springtime

Amethyst Orchid: the floral shaded amethyst orchid introduces a unique touch

The five core classics are:

Inkwell: A deep and intense blackened blue

Buttercream: Smooth Buttercream is an easy and effortless delicious off-white

Desert Mist: Invoking images of shifting powdery sands

Willow: A canopy of green that reveals and conceals

Ultimate Gray: Quietly assuring and reliable gray encouraging composure

*** SPRING-A-DING-DING KNITTED INFINITY LOOP ***

Our knitting friend Lil G requested a pattern suggestion for the DREAM IN COLOR March Pop-up Club selection we featured on our social media. Here's an easy knit cowl idea that would be smashing for the Pop-Up Club, Emma's Yarns March 2021 Crazy Beautiful Club or "Super Silky", MEADOWCROFT DYEWORKS "Rockshelter Sock" or YOUGHIOGHENY YARNS "Silky Yak". A perfect spring layer!

MATERIALS: One skein fingering weight yarn (400 yards); US size 5 circular knitting needles 16"- 20" length OR SIZE NEEDED TO OBTAIN GAUGE; one stitch marker; tapestry needle

GAUGE: 18 sts = 4" in stockinette stitch (gauge not critical)

FINISHED MEASUREMENT: 56" X 6". Cowl is meant to be wrapped double when worn.

INSTRUCTIONS: Cast on 240 stitches; place marker; join to work in the round, being careful not to twist work. Set-up: Work in garter stitch (knit 1 round, purl 1 round) for 6 rounds.

PATTERN (6 round repeat)

Wrap Round: Knit all stitches, wrapping yarn twice around needle for every stitch.

Drop Round: Knit all stitches, dropping extra loop of yarn off the needle when knitting each stitch.

Purl 4 rounds.

Repeat these 6 rounds (wrap round, drop round, and 4 purl rounds) for a total of 9 times or to desired depth. Work garter stitch (Purl 1 round, Knit 1 round) three times. Bind off all stitches loosely. Weave in all ends with tapestry needle and block lightly, if desired.

*** MARYLAND ROAD TRIP MYSTERY SHAWL ***

Spring is coming soon, and plans are underway for a new road-trip knitting adventure! As you may know knitting friends Cynthia Spencer and Valerie Reed collaborated on a mystery shawl called *Pennsylvania Road Trip*. It was our most popular project of 2020! This year, they're on the road again, this time to Valerie's home state of Maryland. We are so excited to share with you our mystery knit along and invite you to join the fun!

The 2021 Road Trip Mystery is a beautiful shawl with an unusual shape. The final shape is a bit of a mystery, but we're told that it's a cross between a triangle shape and a scarf, and very wearable. The pattern is divided into 8 sections, an introduction, a conclusion, and six legs featuring different stitch patterns inspired by various regions, landmarks, and natural wonders found in Maryland.

Like last year, each leg of the journey will include two different stitch patterns to choose from (Cynthia's or Valerie's), opening the door to a grand choose-your-own knitting adventure. The pattern is being released on Ravelry and is available to purchase through Kathy's Kreations as a Ravelry Pro yarn shop. A pre-order edition is available for \$3.98. As the sections release one at a time, beginning on **April 17, 2021** and running through the end of July, the pattern will be updated, and the price will gradually increase to a final cost of \$12.99.

The release of REALLY CLEAR DESIGNS MKAL, *Maryland Road Trip Mystery Shawl*, is intentionally timed to begin on Local Yarn Shop Day, April 17. We are thrilled that Cynthia Spencer will be with us for the kick-off during our Spring Break. Special color packs from BAAH YARNS, who have created eight colorful combos of their “La Jolla” yarn, are now here but selling out quickly. You may see and purchase the color combos in person here at Kathy's Kreations while our supplies last or view them at roadtripmystery.com and pre-order them from us by March 15, 2021 to guarantee delivery by April 17. Last year's project was so much fun that we can't wait to cast on again...

*** KATHY'S KNITTING TIPS ***

A customer's husband recently asked Kathy how to remedy his wife's jabbing herself with a sharp lace tip knitting needle when working on a project. Kathy suggests wearing a small circular Band-aid over the area. The needle will hopefully then jab the band-aid pad instead of your finger. Any other recommendations out there?

Even if you never check your gauge when making afghans, scarves or other projects where exact measurements are not critical, it's important when making a garment! Make a gauge swatch of at least 5" square. Don't hesitate to change needle sizes to get the desired gauge, or try a different type of needle in the same size. Stitch gauge is essential to ensure a good fit around the chest, neck, shoulders, and cuffs. Row gauge is important for sleeve lengths, shoulder depth and often how much yarn you'll require to finish a project. A proper gauge measurement and a good schematic are very useful in achieving the best results...
